Reporting and Academic Achievement

For consistency in reporting, we use a 5 point grading scale. While this is familiar to many of you, below is a reference to what each grade represents. It is important to remember that not only are we only half way through the academic year, but a grade of **satisfactory** indicates that a students is meeting grade level expectations. We reinforce this with our students and particularly discuss this in terms of their effort during certain subjects.


A = Excellent, B = Very Good, C = Satisfactory, D = Developing, E = Experiencing Difficulties

- Excellent – Your child has achieved well beyond what is expected
- Very Good – Your child has achieved above what is expected
- Satisfactory – Your child has achieved what is expected
- Developing – Your child has not yet achieved what is expected
- Experiencing Difficulties – Your child has made minimum achievement

A	Excellent	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B	Very Good	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C	Satisfactory	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D	Developing	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
E	Experiencing Difficulties	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
